SUB-THEME 1 INTRODUCTORY STUDIES

THEME: LIVING TO PLEASE GOD

SUB THEME: INTRODUCTORY STUDIES

TOPIC: LIVING TO PLEASE GOD

TEXT: 1 THESSALONIANS 4: 1-12, EPHESIANS 5: 8-16

AIM: To help participants understand the broad concept of living to please

God, how to please Him, and the consequences of doing otherwise.

INTRODUCTION

Living to please God literally means living to give God pleasure in our daily walk with Him. It begins from the heart of one that has deep love for God, and is therefore constrained by this love to walk with Him consistently in utmost loyalty, living according to His precepts and commandments.

Living to please God should be the ultimate goal of every bona fide child of God, and this should be evidenced in the ways and manners we relate with Him and with other people in any given environment, circumstance or situation. Brainstorming on the following study guides should help broaden our perspectives on this study.

STUDY GUIDE:

- 2. In which specific areas are believers exhorted to strive to please God in their lives? 1 Thess. 4: 3b-8, 9-12, Eph. 5: 11, 17-21, Heb. 13: 15, 16, 1 John 3: 21, 22
- 3. From the following scriptures, identify and discuss some evidences of a life that is pleasing to God? Matt. 7: 16-20, Heb. 11: 6, Rom. 8: 14, Heb. 13: 16, 1 Tim. 2: 1-4
- 4. What are the benefits of living in ways and manners pleasing to God? Prov. 16: 7, John 8: 29
- 5. What happens when we live in ways and manners that displease God? Discuss with example

CONCLUSION:

The life that is pleasing to God is that which glorifies Him, and this is a task we all owe Him in our personal and communal lives - in families, careers, vocations, businesses, neighbourhoods, communities, churches, etc. Pleasing God should be the core motive behind all our decisions,

actions and or inactions. Anything contrary to this would inadvertently pitch us on a collision path with Him.

THEME: LIVING TO PLEASE GOD

SUB THEME: INTRODUCTORY STUDIES

TOPIC: THE NATURE OF GOD

TEXT: JOHN 4: 24, 1 Timothy 1: 17

AIM: To help participants seek clear and in-depth knowledge of God, His

nature, His purpose for humankind, and how such knowledge should help

them live in ways that are pleasing to Him.

INTRODUCTION

There is no gainsaying that urging people to live lives pleasing to a God who is literally a stranger to them is bound to be a futile exercise. Evidences abound of the fact that majority of the persons who warm the churches' pews on a consistent basis are grossly ignorant of the true nature of God whom they profess and claim to serve. More worrisome is the fact that many of these still conceptualize God from certain philosophical viewpoints which cast God in the mould of some impersonal power or influence. But we learn from the Holy Scriptures that the God of the Church is a Person, and except for man's physical existence, shares all the attributes of the human person whom He made in His own image and likeness. In this study we will strive to see how a clear knowledge of the true nature of God will help us live lives that are pleasing to Him.

STUDY GUIDE:

- 1. What do you understand by the concept "the nature of God, and how would you describe God? John 4: 24, 1 Tim. 1: 17
- 2. God is portrayed in the pages of scriptures as a Living Being with distinctive personal characteristics. From the following passages, identify and explain some of these Divine characteristics, 1 Tim. 1: 17, Mal. 3: 6, James 1: 17, Jer. 32: 27, Psa. 139: 7-9, 1 Chr. 28: 9.
- 3. a. Aside from the divine characteristics already discussed, God has certain moral attributes He shares with man. Discuss them in the light of the following scriptures; 1 Pet. 1: 15-17, Psa. 116: 5, 6, 1 John 4: 8, 1 Cor. 1: 9.
 - b. How should knowledge of the divine moral attributes already discussed help us conduct our own lives as God's covenant people?

4. Do you think that a clear knowledge of the true nature of God has any positive bearing on living to please God?

CONCLUSION

A significant aspect of the personal and moral attributes of God reflected in the scriptures is the fact that He "has a personal soul with feelings of grief, anger, repentance, jealousy, hate, fellowship, delight, and other soul passions like other beings." (Dake Annotated Bible, p. 169) Knowledge of this and other facts about God should help us, the bona fide Christians, understand the necessity and urgent need of living to please God.

THEME: LIVING TO PLEASE GOD

TOPIC: BASIC REQUIREMENTS TO PLEASING GOD

TEXT: MICAH 6: 6-8

AIM: To help participants understand that there are conditions which are

indispensable in the believer's endeavours to please God and the

implications of ignoring or making light of them.

INTRODUCTION:

Living to please God should be the primary focus of every bona fide citizen of the heavenly kingdom. Yet it is imperative to equally understand that doing so effectively is subject to strict adherence to certain basic scriptural standards or requirements.

In their honest endeavour to please God, many church folks focus essentially on strict observances of such religious rituals as quiet time, Bible studies, fasting, etc, and doing these without due recourse to meeting the scriptural conditionality for doing so. In this study, we will be brainstorming on these basic scriptural requirements to pleasing God and the dire consequences of reneging on them.

STUDY GUIDE:

- 1. What does the phrase "basic requirements to pleasing God" mean to you?
- 2. Identify from these scriptures, and discuss, the basic requirements to pleasing God. John 3: 3, Heb. 11: 6, Rom. 8: 8, Psa. 147: 10, 11, Phil. 2: 13, Mic. 6: 6-8
- 3. In the light of the above scriptures, what should be the implications of struggling to please God in ways and manners which do not conform to the stipulated standards? Read Matt. 7: 21-23
- 4. Someone once boldly declared; "God is not infinitely pleased with me because of what I do but because of who I am." Given the subject of our discussion, to what extent would this be true?

CONCLUSION:

We must reiterate that God is not as pleased with us because of our dogged commitment to sheer religious observances and the work we do for Him as He is when these are positively anchored on certain fundamental spiritual principles. Knowing these conditions and adhering strictly to them put believers on the pedestal whereon pleasing God would not demand excessive struggle.

Micah 6: 8b: "And what does the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God."

THEME: LIVING TO PLEASE GOD

SUB THEME: INTRODUCTORY STUDIES

TOPIC: COST OF LIVING TO PLEASE GOD

TEXT: Lk 9:23; Lk 14:25-35; Phil 3:4-9

AIMS: To help us recognize that there are costs to living to please God and then

identify and justify why the costs are worth paying.

INTRODUCTION

Living to please God essentially means following Christ. Reading through the Gospels, it is of importance to note that all who offered to or were called to follow Jesus did so at a cost. Starting from the first set of apostles (Peter, Andrew, James and John), whom we learnt, "left all and followed Him" (see Luke 5:11).

Our Lord Jesus never allowed anyone to follow him without making it obvious that following Him comes at a cost. He was not willing to allow any follow Him who would not pay the cost. The prevalent message in today's world seems to be that of Christianity at no cost to the believer which is at variance with everything Christ taught. In this study we will be looking at recalling to our minds that pleasing God comes at a cost and that it is worth paying that cost.

STUDY GUIDE:

- 1. What do you understand by the phrase, "cost of living to please God"?
- 2. From the following scriptures identify the cost(s) that was required of these persons who sought to or were asked to follow Jesus? Mk 1:16-20; Lk 9:57-62; Lk 14:25-27
- 3. From the following scriptures, why do you think these men thought it was worth it to pay with their life the cost of pleasing God? Mat 13:44; 2Cor 4:16-18; Eph 1:15-18
- 4. Discuss in practical terms, the kind of costs we may be required to pay in the world of today in our social, family, work and private life, to live a life that pleases God.
- 5. Following the lives of men like Peter, James, John, Paul, Stephen in the Bible who gave their all to please God, would you say their lives were wasted or worth it? Why or Why not?

CONCLUSION

Cost means what I must give up (pay or sacrifice) to obtain something. Usually as rational beings, we measure what we are willing to pay for something by how much we value that item. For example, someone might be ready to give up his arm or leg to save a child, but may hesitate if it will cost him his life. Living to please God means living as Christ has called us to live, this may mean giving up our time, effort, money and some time freedom or life to do that thing that is pleasing to God. I will only be willing to give these up to the extent that I value the life that I have received in Christ.

SUB-THEME 2 LIFESTYLE THAT PLEASES GOD

THEME: LIVING TO PLEASE GOD

SUB THEME: LIFESTYLE THAT PLEASES GOD

TOPIC: LIFESTYLE OF PURITY

TEXT: Exo 25: 11,17,24,29,31,36,38,39; 1 Thessalonians 4: 1-8, Mat 5:8

AIM: Participants should be able to explain why we should and how we can

live a life of purity.

INTRODUCTION

Purity can be defined as being free from adulteration, impurity, defilement or corruption of any kind. It means that a particular thing is in its pure original and true state without anything adulteration.

From the 25th to the 39th chapter of the book of Exodus, the word pure was mentioned 31 times in the KJV version of the Bible (pure gold, pure oil, pure myrrh, pure frankincense, pure candlestick etc) and each time it was in relation to the items that will be placed or used in the tabernacle. God would not accept anything that was not pure as part of what to use in building the tabernacle where he was to dwell or in the garment to be worn by the High Priest who was the only one allowed to come into the Holy of Holies where God will meet with him.

In the New Testament the scriptures declare to us that we are the temple of God (1 Corinth. 6: 19), and if God required the temples made of hand by men to be filled with vessels made of pure materials; what do we think is required of us whom these symbols of the tabernacle in the old testament spoke of. In our study we will be looking at why purity is required of us and how God has made it possible for us to live such a life.

STUDY GUIDE:

- 3. From the following scriptures how can we maintain a lifestyle of purity in the world of today? 1Jn 3:3; Ps 119:9; Phil 4:8; Mat 12:33-35; 1Cor 15:3

4. What are some of the challenges a believer faces maintaining a life of purity in today's

world.

CONCLUSION

Most times we limit purity to sexual purity, but looking through the scriptures it is obvious that

the lifestyle of purity we are called to is not limited to abstaining from sexual immorality or

fornication. We are called to purity (freedom from adulteration or contamination), in every area

of our life- in our thinking, wisdom, speech, religion, faith, and love etc.

As shown to us in the building of the tabernacles in the Old Testament, God required purity in

the materials to be used in making the vessels that would be part of His temples. Much more is

required of us whom these tabernacles of old were a shadow of. Our faith in Christ and reliance

on His Spirit in us enable us to live such a life of purity even in a world where it looks almost

impossible to do so.

Mat 5: 8 "Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God"

EXAMINE YOURSELF

Are you pursuing purity in every area of your life?

THEME: LIVING TO PLEASE GOD

SUB THEME: LIFESTYLE THAT PLEASES GOD

TOPIC: LIFESTYLE OF LOVE

TEXT: 1 Cor 13: 1-8; 1 Thessalonians 4: 9-10; 1 John 4: 7-21

AIM: Participants will understand what it means to live a lifestyle of love and

why God requires it of His children.

INTRODUCTION

The word love is a word commonly used in the world but could also be said to be the most easily misunderstood. If we take a sample of the poems, songs, books, films ever written or produced in the world today it would not be surprising to find out that love is the topic of majority of them. Yet we live in a world where the stark reality of lack of love confronts us daily in the suspicion and hatred among different denominations in the church, murders, killings, kidnappings, terror attacks, rapes of minors and adults, neglect and exploitation of the poor and weak, corrupt practices by those in governance, market and pulpit.

What exactly then is love and how do we know we are living a lifestyle of love? In 1 Jn 4:8, the apostle of love, John declares to us that God is love. We must discard all we now know about love and turn to God who Himself is love to truly learn what love is and how we can live such a lifestyle.

STUDY GUIDE:

- 1. How would you describe the term love, and the phrase, lifestyle of love?
- 2. Identify the key characteristics of love as described in 1 Cor 13:4-7 and what we can learn from them in terms of how we should feel or act.
- 3. In 1 Cor 12:31, the verse immediately preceding 1 Cor 13, Paul introduced love as a more excellent way compared to the best of spiritual gifts. Why do you think he described it so? 1 Cor 13:1-3; 1 John 4: 7-8; Jn 13:35
- 4. How can we as believers learn to live a lifestyle of love that pleases God? Jn 1:12; Rom 5:5; 2 Pet 1:3-10

CONCLUSION

Two common objection against living a lifestyle of love as described is that, living so will make such a person a doormat (stupid or naive) and secondly how can you show love to someone when your feeling are mostly of dislike towards the person. A response to the first objection would be to look at Jesus, who lived out life of love while on earth. For the second objection, a look at our key passage 1 Cor 13:4-7, clearly shows that love is not about how we feel, but about what we do in spite of how we feel about the person.

A personal exercise as we conclude, pick a piece of paper and draw two columns; name the first column 'Love Strengths' and the other 'Love Weaknesses'. For each of the 16 characteristics listed 1 Cor 13:4-7 put your name in place of love (e.g. Nosa is Kind, Nosa is not puffed up etc.) and see if it sounds true of how you act towards others. If yes put it in the first column, if not the second. Give thanks to God for the strengths in the first column, ask God for help in your area of weaknesses, and trust Him to make you grow more into the likeness of Christ.

Jn 13:35: By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.

EXAMINE YOURSELF

Are you acting on God's commandment for us to love?

THEME: LIVING TO PLEASE GOD

SUB THEME: LIFESTYLE THAT PLEASES GOD

TOPIC: LIFESTYLE OF FAITH

TEXT: MARK 11:12-24; GENESIS 12:1-5; HEBREWS 11:1-6

AIMS: (i) To highlight the meaning and importance of the lifestyle of faith

(ii) And to demonstrate that without faith no one can please God.

INTRODUCTION

Faith has been defined as "assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (Heb. 11:1). Everything about our walk with God bothers on faith. It is by faith we believe we are children of God by adoption; by faith we believe there is God as we have never seen Him; and by faith we receive our forgiveness of sins, sanctification, miracle, and so on. The Christian journey is a journey of faith from the beginning to the end. This is why it is impossible to please God without faith.

Our study highlights the importance of the life of faith. God also demands that we obey Him by faith and by so doing, we will receive His blessings.

STUDY GUIDE:

By living a life of faith, believers can quench all flaming darts of the enemy. Activate your faith today and you will enjoy your Christian walk even in threatening circumstances.

THEME: LIVING TO PLEASE GOD

SUB THEME: LIFESTYLE THAT PLEASES GOD

TOPIC: LIFESTYLE OF PRAYER

TEXT: LUKE 2: 36-38; ACTS 4: 23-33

AIM: To teach the importance of prayer in the life of a believer

INTRODUCTION

An old Scripture Union song has the lyrics: "Prayer is the key; Prayer is the master key..." Prayer is so essential in the life of a believer because it is the only means by which we communicate with God. We express our worship, stewardship, gratitude, feelings and supplications through prayers. Through prayers, we draw incredible divine strength, power, courage, wisdom, etc for our earthly manifestation. Hence, it is often said that a prayerless Christian is a powerless Christian.

STUDY GUIDE

- 4. Discuss how we can improve on our daily lifestyle of prayer. Luke 18: 1; 1 Thes. 5: 17, Eph. 6: 18a

CONCLUSION

Prayer is not optional to a Christian. There is no alternative to prayers. For the church to experience revival and the move of the Holy Spirit, there must be a deliberate engagement to fervent and effectual prayers.

SUB THEME: LIFESTYLE THAT PLEASES GOD

TOPIC: LIFESTYLE OF FELLOWSHIP

TEXT: Acts 2: 42-47; Hebrews 10:25

AIM: To discuss the meaning and importance of lifestyle of fellowship and

how it can help believers in these perilous days

INTRODUCTION:

Fellowship simply means "friendly association" especially with people who share common interest. God Himself initiated fellowship in the Garden of Eden. He comes around in the Garden, "watching in the garden in the cool of the day" (Gen. 3:8) obviously to share fellowship with the man and woman. Fellowship generates warmth, gives identity and equally builds up the body of Christ.

STUDY GUIDE:

- 1. In your own words, discuss the meaning of fellowship and what it means to have a lifestyle of fellowship
- 2. Read Acts 2: 42-47, discuss what happens when there is genuine fellowship under the following:
 - a. Devotion Acts 2:42
 - b. Signs and wonders Acts 2:43
 - c. Warmth Acts 2:44
 - d. Selflessness Acts 2:45
 - e. Worship/Communion Acts 2: 46-47
 - f. Are these still in existence today?
- 3. a. Read Eccl. 4: 9-12: What do we learn further about the importance of fellowship?
 - b. Discuss what fellowship is NOT and hindrances to fellowship
- 4. Discuss how believers can encourage one another through fellowship, Heb. 10:24-25
- 5. Is it possible for believers to stand alone without fellowshipping with others?

Heb. 10: 24-25; Eccl. 4: 9-12

b. How can we improve on genuine fellowship in our churches today?

CONCLUSION

God in His wisdom knows we need one another to grow. Let us therefore, not despise fellowship. It will help in building and preparing us for eternity in heaven.

MEMEORY VERSE:

Heb. 10: 25: "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching"

THEME: LIVING TO PLEASE GOD

SUB THEME: LIFESTYLE THAT PLEASES GOD

TOPIC: LIFESTYLE OF SOUL WINNING

TEXT: ACTS 8:1-40; PROV. 11:30

AIM: To help the participants understand that soul winning pleases God and to

see the need for and benefits of soul winning

INTRODUCTION:

The Bible records that man became a living soul after God breathed into Adam's (the first man created) nostril (Gen 2:7) and in Gen. 12:13 & Ez. 18:4 & 20 the Bible made us to understand that the soul controls life. It can also sin (Lev. 5:1). The Miriam Webstar Dictionary defines soul as "the spiritual part of a person that is believed to give life to the body and in many religions is believed to live forever".

Therefore, any person whose lifestyle is characterized by soul winning is an important tool in God's kingdom as he/she saves a soul from death and by so doing helps to populate heaven and depopulate hell in fulfillment of God's mandate in Matthew 28:19. God calls a soul winner "wise" in other words he/she is always in tune with heaven's needs. (Prov. 11:30). May God help us to be part of His end time army in Jesus' name. Amen

- 3. a. Read the following passages and state some biblical methods of soul winning. Acts 1:1-2, Jn. 4:28-30, 1:40-41, Lk 10:1, Mt. 10:5-8, Acts 8:5-8,26-40
 - b. From the above scriptures, who can win souls for Christ
- 4. What are the rewards for soul winning?
 - a. Here on earth Acts 8:6-7, 8, 12, 14; Dan 12:3, Lk 12: 8, 1Cor. 9: 16-17
 - b. Here after (in Eternity) Rev. 3: 21; Dan. 12: 3
- 5. Persecution and obedience led some of the early disciples to win souls Acts 8:1, 26 What opportunities do you have today?

CONCLUSION:

Jesus won souls through his lifestyle and ministry (Acts 1:1-2), the woman of Samaria won souls through her testimony (Jn. 4:28-30), Andrew brought his brother Simon to Christ on one-on-one evangelism (Jn. 1:40-41), Jesus sent his disciples two by two (Lk. 10:1), Jesus also sent his disciples as a group (Mt. 10:5-8), Philip was sent on a personal evangelism to the Ethiopian eunuch (Acts 8:26-40). Soul winning (Evangelism) has been and is still God's heartbeat. It is Christ's first injunction to His disciples after His resurrection (Mt. 28:16-20, Mk. 16:15-18, Lk. 24:47-49, Acts 1:8)

Therefore, be wise and win souls for Christ!

TOPIC: LIFESTYLE OF STUDY

AIM: To remind believers to go back to a lifestyle of studying God's word for

in it we will find prosperity and good success.

INTRODUCTION:

Daniel set his heart to study (read, memorize facts etc.) Israel's history as recorded in 2 Chr. 36:21 & Jer. 25:11 and found out that Israel would be in captivity for seventy (70) years. The Berean Christians were considered more noble than the Thessalonians because they studied the Scriptures after Paul preached to them (Acts 17:10-11). In Joshua 1:8, God commanded Joshua "this book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success".

It is obvious from the above scriptural lessons that a lifestyle of studying God's word will lead to prosperity and good success. It has the power to admonish, guide, remind and correct us to ensure that we do not miss the mark and go astray.

does not necessarily depend on the quantity of the gift but the quality of

our heart and motive.

INTRODUCTION

A careful examination of God's creation will teach us that just as there are physical laws which brings order out of chaos in the Universe, God has also put in place spiritual laws which governs life. One of which is the law of generosity or giving. The Scripture says that "whoever sows generously will also reap generously" (2 Cor. 9; 6). It is this basic attitude of the early Christians that laid the foundation for every expression of giving we have now. Giving was expressed in their understanding of stewardship and is a mark of a surrendered life.

among Christians.

INTRODUCTION

One sure way of disarming your enemies from accusing you of wrong doing is to exhibit a life style of integrity. It is a life of high moral and spiritual standard, void of lying, cheating, dishonesty, insincerity, etc. Integrity is the inner sense of wholesomeness carrying the quality of honesty, truthfulness, accuracy and consistency of character. A life style of integrity is the individual moral and ethical standard. Integrity holds to the Pauline principles of thinking and acting on whatever that is true, whatever that is noble, whatever that is right, pure, admirable and lovely. (Phil.4:8) It is void of hypocrisy.

We must at all time set the standard principles of life to walk in them. We must exhibit the character of truthfulness, faithfulness, humility and accountability.

TEXT: EPHESIANS 5:21 - 23, 1 PETER 3: 1 - 7

AIM: a. To explain how much God expects couples to live with great spiritual

and moral principles and impact on the environment

b. To show that home is the starting point for spiritual and moral

behavior that pleases God.

INTRODUCTION

The relationship among married couples at home is the building block on which the various social characters of the society begin. If the characters and behavioural pattern are not inherited from parents to offspring, it could be developed or learnt over time through constant family interaction. God so much depends on parents for the character molding (modeling) of their children as well as that of the society. Parents in their calling are responsible for training their children to keep the way of the Lord by doing what is right and just. This is possible only where the parents themselves are upright and pleasing before God in their beliefs and conduct.

The man is to love his wife, they are to put aside their own interest and care for the other while the wife willingly follow the leadership of their husband by so doing, they can raise a godly generation that is pleasing to God.

AIMS: To help participants understand the meaning engagement and courtship,

and that:

a. Courtship period is for sexual purity

b. Men are to be just in their relationship

c. It is good to listen to the Holy Spirit in every decision making.

INTRODUCTION:

Courtship is a period of seeking to know God's will and to gain love or affection from an intended partner. Its purpose is to provide a would-be couple time to discover, assess, and evaluate their compatibility as potential for a lifelong marriage relationship. Courtship is not a time of experimentation but of exploration, or a mutual commitment made between a man and a woman, only as a result of knowing God's will for each other, for the purpose of "getting to know each other and their background better and preparing themselves for marriage within the next few time with the clear understanding that if the courtship does not work out, both persons are to be mature enough to part as friends, without resentment and with all due respect for each other's feelings".

Engagement is a time of serious step of firm commitment to marry having received clear guidance from the Lord in the decision to marry, a time to plan for the marriage proper. The length of an engagement will vary according to different circumstances. Courtship is the prelude to a possible engagement. The Scripture refer to engagement as betrothal or espousal as shown in the case of Mary and Joseph and also mentioned in the Song of Solomon.

guidance of the Holy Spirit and prayers are dependent on understanding clearly what one's

spiritual responsibilities and convictions are.

AIMS: At the end of the study, participants shall be able to understand:

a. What true parenting is

b. The importance of training our children in godly ways.

c. The consequences of not training our children in godly ways.

INTRODUCTION:

Christian Parenting is a systematic and continuous training, guiding and upbringing process of a child to grow maturely both physically, socially, psychologically and spiritually in the knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. Parenting is duplicating our Christian nature in our younger ones. It takes time, care, persistence and persuasion to achieve.

God commands parents to train and bring up their children in the knowledge and fear of Him. The fifth commandment has a promise of good and long life for every child who obeys in good parenting (Ex.20:12). It is the role of parents to do that. Today, this responsibility has been shifted by most parents to schools, neighbours, house helps and others in the streets due to parents are now too busy with economic pursuance. Parenting is more than giving children daily food and clothing. It encompasses all about their entire wellbeing. However, the consequences of this neglect have a lot of negative impact in our society.

God is not a lazy God as many of us think today; neither is He a magician who multiplies people's lazy efforts. One cannot reap where he did not sow and whatsoever a man's sows the same he reaps. Today's prosperity messages we hear all around us seem to create a danger in our faith if we fail to understand that God as a God of principle blesses the works of the diligent, and rejects the slothful in all ramifications.

Adam and Eve were created by God and put in the garden to work. All men whom God had called and used were all busy when He called them (the Prophets and the 12 Apostles). Many in our society and in churches, who are complaining of poverty, are daily folding hands, idle at home and yet praying and waiting on God to multiply blessings on empty plans. May this study help us to understand that God desires us to work so that He can bless the work of our hands.

INTRODUCTION:

Christian Ministry/service is an act of carrying forth Christ mission in the world. All through the scripture, it is seen as service to God and others out of devotion to Christ and love for others (Mk 10:42). Every genuine child of God is endued with a gift/ grace to do at least one ministry or the other. Many today have their own gifts either unutilized or under- utilized due to carelessness or ignorance. As a result, many of our churches are currently unhealthy as the true mark of a healthy church is when every member is actively and meaningfully involved in ministry/service as directed by the Holy Spirit. God expects the application of our utmost zeal and fervent spirit in our daily discharge of these ministries and their final fulfillment.

Jesus' pattern in ministry and even that of His disciples was such that received not services but gave it to people (Matt. 20:28). Anointed with Holy Ghost and power, Jesus pursued His ministry to the end and no wonder God was pleased with Him. As His disciples of today we have sufficient grace and anointing commensurate with every level of our responsibilities. May the revival flame of God rekindle our zeal for His acceptable service/ministry as we go through this study.

AIM: To encourage Christian to show active and exemplary

participation in our national politics as a means of promoting

Godliness and good governance that pleases God.

INTRODUCTION:

Politic is the activities, actions and policies used to gain and hold a position of governance over a human community/society. As followers of Christ, our attitude and involvement with these activities must be of Christ in order to please God. Some truths are obvious about Christian interest on these political activities. First, God will permeate and supersede every aspect of life and as such His fixed plans and purpose are inviolable. No government or political activities can thwart God's will (Dan 4:34-35) since He sets up and dethrones kings (Dan 2:21). An understanding of this will help one see politics as a mere method God uses to accomplish His will.

Secondly, Christ must be the Lord of our political views. People whose lives are otherwise in submission to Christ have a tendency to violate His Lordship when issues of politics are raised.

Finally we must grasp the fact that no political government can save us, rather only God can. As such, Jesus nor His disciple ever spent time and energy schooling believing on how to reform the corruption and evils of the world through government alone but majorly through proclamation of Gospel and living lives that give clear evidence to Gospel transforming power. Knowledge and practice of these truths will distinguish a Christian in active politics from others as the strength to please God lies on them.

CONCLUSION:

Politics just like every other vocation should be actively practiced by personal calling and convictions and not a game for all as in our present society. Total abstinence from it by Christians makes it difficult to enforce God's ordinance and counsel into our society which we are all enjoyed to be subject to without resisting. The politics that please God is the one that recognizes its authority as from God and as such yields itself as instrument to accomplish the will of God.

TOPIC: WORLDLY ALLUREMENTS

TEXT: 1 JOHN 2: 15 – 17, JOSHUA 7: 1 – 20, 26

AIM: To encourage Christians to seek Godly understanding of the

worthlessness of this world and the wisdom to keep distance from

its enticement in order to please God effectively.

INTRODUCTION:

The term WORLD most often in the scripture refers to the vast system of this present age under satanic promotion and slavery. It consists of both the evils, immoral and sinful pleasures of it as well as the spirit of rebellion or indifference to God and His revelation existing within all human enterprise not under the Lordship of Christ. Worldly allurement therefore is the satanic use of these ideas through government, culture, religion, economic, mass media etc to distract God's people and oppose God and His righteous standard.

The resultant effect include raising believers whose claim to love God is blinded by selfishness, as the fire of God's true love and service which produces life that pleases God has gone off. However God's sovereignty over the whole world is undisputable as all things happen under His permissive will. He has purposely limited His supreme power and rule over the present world temporary waiting for the time determined by His wisdom. Then all the evil systems of the world and Satan will be destroyed for the rightful kingdom of our Lord and His Christ and He shall reign forever and ever (Rev 11: 15).

It is only the Christian faith that is anchored on Christ that can overcome this present worldly allurement. Such faith is the type that sees eternal realities, experiences the power of God and love for Christ to such an extent that the sinful pleasure and values of this decaying world is not anything to be attracted to nor to be looked upon. May such faith be renewed in us again so that living to please God will be our daily pursuit.

TOPIC: ECONOMIC PRESSURE

TEXT: HEB. 13:5-6; MATT. 6:25-34

AIM: To let us know as children of God, that God is our main source of supply;

and that even in recession time, God will never leave or forsake you.

Recessions cause economic pressure in a society. What then is Economic Pressure? It is when an individual, society or country is facing undesirable economic hard times. It may occur when unemployment rates are higher than usual; when cost increases, when purchasing power reduces, when demand is greater than supply etc.

Economic Pressure is felt and responded to in different ways by different people or society. As a child of God, this study is to strengthen your faith and trust in God. It will make us understand that God is our All sufficiency (2 Cor. 3:5; 9:8).

AIM: (i) To encourage believers to improve on their health status

ii. To challenge us on how to appropriate the healing power of God when we have health challenges

INTRODUCTION:

Around the globe, Nigeria inclusive, the problems and challenges caused by ill health pose major threats and burden to individuals and the society. With the economic cost of diseases, the bite of poverty and corresponding low profile living in the country, it is apparent that the society is in dire need of effective health care system. World Health Organization information reveals that over 7.5 million children under age 5 die from malnutrition and other preventable diseases every year. Worldwide, at least 2.6 million people die each year as a result of being overweight or obese. Malaria causes some 225 million acute illnesses and 1 million people die annually.

In this study, we shall examine the implications of health challenges to believers in Christ and equip them with scriptural and divine solutions to them. We shall endeavour to see how we can improve our health through healthy living lifestyle, dietary habit and cope with the challenges of ill health.

AIM: To let us know that God's time is the best; and that delay is not denial.

INTRODUCTION:

Life is full of storms and challenges. Waiting for God to fulfill His promise is one of the hardest tasks a Christian can face in life. It is worthy to note that the strongest weapon a believer has, is patience. Ancient & Modern 356 will help us in this study. Stanza 7 says, "Not Mine, Not Mine, The Choice; In Things or Great or Small; Be Thou My Guide, My Strength, My Wisdom, And My All".

In as much as we have our expectations and aspirations, at times, they can be delayed. Delay can mean, a slow down or a period of time by which something is late or postponed. Habakkuk says, "For the vision is yet for an appointed time but at the end it shall speak, and not lie: though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry". (Hab. 1:3). AIM: To show believers that satanic onslaughts are real and how to handle

them victoriously.

INTRODUCTION:

Satanic onslaughts refer to the various forms or shades of attack unleashed against believers in Christ from satanic strongholds or pit of hell (kingdom of darkness). Usually, Satan manipulates natural phenomenon or human persons against the believers, so as to subdue them to do his will. The experiences of Job from our text, underscore the fiery nature of this onslaught against believers and the Church at large.

Same scriptures also point to us the need to live courageously in firmness of faith, so as to appropriate the grace of victory in our quest to please God.

AIM: To teach believers what divine peace is all about, the various shades of

divine peace, factors that hinder the attainment of divine peace in a

believers life and the basic steps we can take to access divine peace.

INTRODUCTION:

Divine peace is the peace that comes from God; the peace that God gives to a person. Solomon was one person that experienced divine peace, unlike David his father, who has several troubles to contend with including household and external battles.

b. The Peace of Fellowship (The Peace of Conscience Void of Offence); this is the

personal peace which God gives to an individual through fellowship with the Lord

and through walking in concord with God with all known sins confessed and

turned over to God's grace and knowledge of all things. 1 John 1:19, 3:19-21,

Gal. 5:22, 1 Tim. 1:5, Acts 24:16

- c. The Peace of Assurance (The Peace of God); this is the peace that comes from being confident of God's supply and that God is in control. This is the peace that settles our nerves, fills our mind, and allows us to relax even in the midst of uproar around us. Phil 4:6-9, Gal. 5:22, Ps. 119:165, Prov. 3:13-17.
- d. The Peace of Harmony (Peace with Others); this is the peace of unity and oneness in the body of Christ, that is oneness of mind and purpose. God reaps a harvest of peace where there are believers sowing and watering their mind with the word of God. But Satan seeks to reap a harvest of discord through feelings of hurt, unwillingness to forgive and selfish ambition when people refuse to operate on the principles and promises of God's word. Mark 9:34, 50, Acts 2:42-47, Eph. 4:3, Phil. 2:2-4, 1 Thess. 5:13, 1 Cor. 2:6-11,
- e. The Peace of the State (Public Peace); this is the peace which a state (nation) enjoys. That is a state or society without war or turbulence. This aspect of peace comes through good rulers or government acting in accordance with principles of God's word and through strong nucleus of godly citizens who apply and live by the truth of the scriptures. Acts 24:2, Rom. 13:1-7, 1 Tim. 2:2.
- f. The Peace of Pronounced Blessing; this refers to the wish and prayer for spiritual and physical prosperity, security and the safety of others. This is seen in most salutations of Paul and in John 20:19, 21, 26
- g. The Peace of Orderliness; this refers to the peace that comes from doing things decently and in order. 1 Cor. 14:40
- h. Global Peace; this refers to a situation devoid of wars or conflicts within the circles of the world. However, global or world peace will only be attained with the return and reign of Jesus Christ and until then, the will be wars and rumors of wars. Matt. 24, Rom. 16:20, Rev. 20
- 3. Identify the spheres or areas in which divine peace exists in your life as a believer and the church in general.
- 4. What are the factors that can hinder a believer from enjoying this divine peace? Gen. 2:16-17, Isaiah 59:2

AIM: To teach believers that true prosperity comes from God alone especially

to those who live to please Him

INTRODUCTION:

Generational prosperity therefore, could be defined as a continuous, going and eternal progressive state of success and blessings in a given lineage or family. It is not a momentary or passing phenomenon. It is the characteristics of that family or lineage that God has blessed.

According to Kenneth Copeland "the world's definition of prosperity is financial, political and military power. But true prosperity is the ability to use God's ability and power to meet the needs of mankind-spirit, soul, body, financially and socially"

Biblical prosperity therefore includes: Spiritual prosperity (John 3: 3-7), Mental prosperity (Phil. 4: 6-7), and Physical prosperity (3John 2). We shall therefore discuss in this study, what generational posterity means, identify God's promises of prosperity, the truth of the gospel of prosperity in relation with the scriptures and our views on contemporary prosperity preachers and the perils/blessings of prosperity.

TOPIC: DIVINE SECURITY

TEXT: Psalm 91, 125

AIM: To help brethren understand the scope of divine security and how to

access them.

INTRODUCTION

Security has been one of the greatest challenges of man. It is all encompassing. It is not just enough to acquire something, the sustainability of what has been acquired is much more important. Yet above all is the security of life both here on earth and in eternity with the Lord.

AIM: To help participants understand that durable promotion can only come

from the Lord, the possessor of all things.

INTRODUCTION

Promotion is an integral part of man's life. No one wants to remain at a stage for too long. We long to move forward in all human endeavours. However, in most cases, it often ends as effort in futility without the Lord as indicated in Psalms 127:1 that "Except the Lord build the house, they labour in vain that build it: except the Lord keep the city, the watchman waketh but in vain".

Divine promotion is therefore the lifting and advancement in rank, position, anointing and so on that comes neither from the east nor from the south but from the Lord God. This kind of promotion is often overwhelming and durable. Unlike promotion that comes from man, divine promotion strives even in famine, lack and in all life circumstances.

This study will therefore x-ray the criteria and biblical examples of divine promotion as well as its enemies and how to curb them.

INTRODUCTION

Right from the fall of the first Adam, man has been entangled by all manner of sins and huddles in life. Man has been in perpetual bondage longing to be delivered until the second Adam - the Lord Jesus came for the liberation of mankind. He is the truth personified. In John 8:32 the Lord declared ' and you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free"

Deliverance is the act of being rescued, ransomed or set free from sin, ignorance, fear, bondage, danger, evil lifestyles or demons. AIM:

To help participants understand the meaning of advent, the purpose of the first advent and how to appropriate the benefits of the first advent.

INTRODUCTION:

Advent is the Church season that begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas, or the nearest Sunday to November 30. It is the beginning of the Church year, and it lasts for four Sundays. According to www.gotquestion.org from an article 'What is Advent?; the word advent itself means "arrival" or "an appearing or coming into place". The Advent celebration is both a commemoration of Christ's first coming and an anticipation of His second coming. Hence, Christians often speak of Christ's "first advent" and "second coming" to earth. In this study, however, we shall be focusing on the first advent.

CONCLUSION

The purpose of the first advent is no doubt, to give salvation to everyone who has expressed personal faith in Christ Jesus. And this is available to everyone by grace no matter ones racial, denominational or national cleavages. Hence, the Lord declared that He came "to seek and to save that which was lost" (Luke 19: 10 NKJV). Appropriating the benefits of His first coming is the key to living a fulfilled life that pleases God.

The resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead is a major doctrine of the Bible. It is an attestation that God raised His Son from the grave after three days. The doctrine is the heart of our faith, and the uniqueness of Christianity. Though critics still doubt it, it was evidenced in the scripture that Jesus resurrected. This was shown in His appearance to the two disciples on

the way to Emmaus (Luke 24:29-33), the doubting Thomas (John 20:27), Peter and other disciples (John 21:5-7), Paul and others.

The Resurrection, was not just an ordinary event but a demonstration of God's power in making His Son who was dead to rise again the third day. In this study, we shall examine the importance of that power, and how to walk daily in it.

STUDY GUIDE:

INTRODUCTION:

"Ascension" literally means going up from a lower place to a higher place. Jesus ascended from earth to heaven forty days after His resurrection. It was necessary to return back to His Father after accomplishing His mission on earth. As the power of the grave could not hold Him back, so the gravitational forces could not pull Him down. The same power that raised Him

also lifted Him to the sky to the presence of God. What are the biblical proofs of His ascension, and the blessing the church derives from it? These and more we will discover in this study

STUDY GUIDE:

- 1. What do you understand by the term Ascension of Christ? Why must Christ ascend to heaven after His resurrection John 16:17, Rom 8:34, John 14:2, Heb 4:14-16, Eph 4:8-13.
- 2. The Ascension was a commissioning event by Jesus. Discuss Acts 11:3-9, Matt 16:15-20
- 3. What were the Biblical proofs about the ascension of Jesus Christ? (Ps 68:18, Ps 24:7 John 6:62, John 20:17)
- 4. I what ways does the second coming of Jesus Christ relate to His ascension? Acts 1:11, 3:20-21
- 5. "Then we which are alive and remain, shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord" (1 Thess 4:17) Identify and discus ways to prepare ourselves for this glorious event- the ascension of believers (Heb 12: 14, Heb10:19-25).

CONCLUSION:

The ascension is a major biblical doctrine, which describes the returning back into the presence of God by Jesus Christ after His earthly mission. It was predicted by the Old Testament prophets, talked by Jesus Himself and experienced by the disciples. It's importance hinges on the coming of the Holy Spirit and His gifts; the priestly intercessory ministry of Jesus Christ for the believers; and as a pledge for His second coming to ascend with the believers to heaven. We therefore must appreciate His prayers for us at the altar in heaven, and prepare ourselves for His second coming.

AIM: To understand the purpose of Pentecost and how to avail

ourselves of its benefits

INTRODUCTION:

The Pentecost also called the Whit Sunday is derived from the Greek name "Pentecost" which means fiftieth. It is celebrated on the 7th Sunday after Easter or 50 days after Easter. The event is to mark the descent of the Holy Spirit on the disciples as promised by Jesus before His ascension. Originally, it used to be a day of celebration of wheat harvest in the Old Testament

which requires all Jews wherever they reside to return home for such celebration. In this study, we shall learn about the importance of Pentecost to the church of Jesus Christ.

That was fulfilled fifty days after His resurrection - on the day of Pentecost. It was necessary for the Holy Spirit to come, because through His power and gifts, believers will be spiritually equipped, and the Kingdom of God will increase in number and spiritual strength. We must therefore open our hearts to receive Him, so that the acts of the Holy Spirit will manifest in our time.

friends than it is to live for Christ in the home. Your own family circle knows whether Christ lives in you and through you.

Our nation is in desperate need of consecrated Christian mothers. If we have more Christian mothers, we would have less delinquency, immorality, godliness and fewer broken homes. Every mother owes it to her children to accept Christ as her personal savior so that she can be the influence for good in the lives of those whom Christ has graciously given to her. The influence of a mother upon the lives of her children in her home cannot be measured. They know and absorb her example and attitudes when it comes to questions of honesty, life habits, kindness and hard work.

INTRODUCTION:

So many times, we make the mistake of interpreting some of the words in the bible with the mind-set of our modern language with the consequence that we are taken far away from the intended meaning. The text we are considering here is a clear example of this textual injustice. It is a prophecy concerning a future perilous time that was to severely test the faith of the chosen nation.

Historically, this event is said to have already been fulfilled when **Antiochus Epiphany** offered pig upon the altar in the holy Temple, thereby desecrating it, an incident that led in part to what is commonly called the Maccabean Revolt led by Judas Maccabee who, together with his revolt company should be more appropriately the 'men of exploits' in the text. They are the real men of exploits.

STUDY GUIDE:

Let's all say no to fake Christianity and resolve to firmly resist deceptive gospel in all its varied forms no matter what it costs. Let our fathers rise and face up to the challenge of defending our homes, families and the church against falsehood. Let our men stand up and bravely defend the church against the scourge of the seduction of Christianity.

AIM: To identify the different seasons of life mentioned in the key text with a

view to helping us understanding the underlying principles and how they

apply to our lives as God's people

INTRODUCTION:

Generally, life is a cycle of seasons. The Scripture listed six seasons as follows: 'seed' time (a time for seed planting); 'Harvest' time, a time for reaping and rewards. This is followed by 'winter' (cold/dry) season, when nothing seems to be working. Then there is 'summer' (heat)

season, a time of embrace when one feels generally relaxed and at ease. Then we also have 'Night' season, a time to dream, when no one appears to notice us; and finally, there is the 'Day' season, when one begins to easily get noticed. However, the focus of this study is on the principles of seed time and harvest.

STUDY GUIDE:

- 1. Identify the six different phases in the seasonal cycle as mentioned in Gen.8:22
- 2. What are the characteristics of each of these six seasons as we know them in our world, that is, physically; and how may we apply them in our spiritual walk?
- 3. What specific principles govern seedtime and harvest? Gen. 8:20-22; Exo.23:16 (cf. 2 Thes.3:10); Psalm 126:5; Mal. 1:6-8, 14; Luke 6:38; 2 Cor. 8:5; 9:6; Gal.6:7.
- 4. "Anyone who has not sown has no right to expect any form of harvest, just as anyone who has sown should expect to harvest". Discuss.
- 5. In the light of the above, would you say God has any right to expect bountiful harvest from us individually and collectively? If yes, why is it that many do not see any need to sow or invest meaningfully into God's work?

CONCLUSION:

It should never be forgotten that certain principles govern seed time and harvest, that is, sowing and harvesting or reaping. What we sow is what we reap. Therefore, we can conclude that God Almighty has every right to expect bountiful harvest from all of us because He has invested so much in our lives. Our yearly harvest time can be an opportunity to express to Him just how much we are grateful.

in the Church.

INTRODUCTION:

Revival has been described as an awakening, a renewal, God's special time of blessing in overwhelming reality. At revival, one is left with a profound realization of God's awesomeness, greatness, power, holiness and worthiness. Correspondingly, one is also gripped with a sense of shame, sinfulness and unworthiness; just as more is accomplished in a relatively short time that

one could not dream of accomplishing in perhaps several years of strenuous labour and ministry. Genuine revival is the focus of this study.

- 4. In the light of these truths, what are some of the issues the Church must deal with in order to cultivate an enabling environment for genuine revival to come and or thrive?

CONCLUSION:

Revival Days are abnormal days in the life of the Church. They are supernormal, supernatural and profound. They are days in the life of the Church when God so manifests His presence that one is left in no doubt as to how real it is. But the Holy Spirit is the Agent acting upon the Word of God which is the principal instrument. However, leaders of the church must be alive to their responsibilities.
